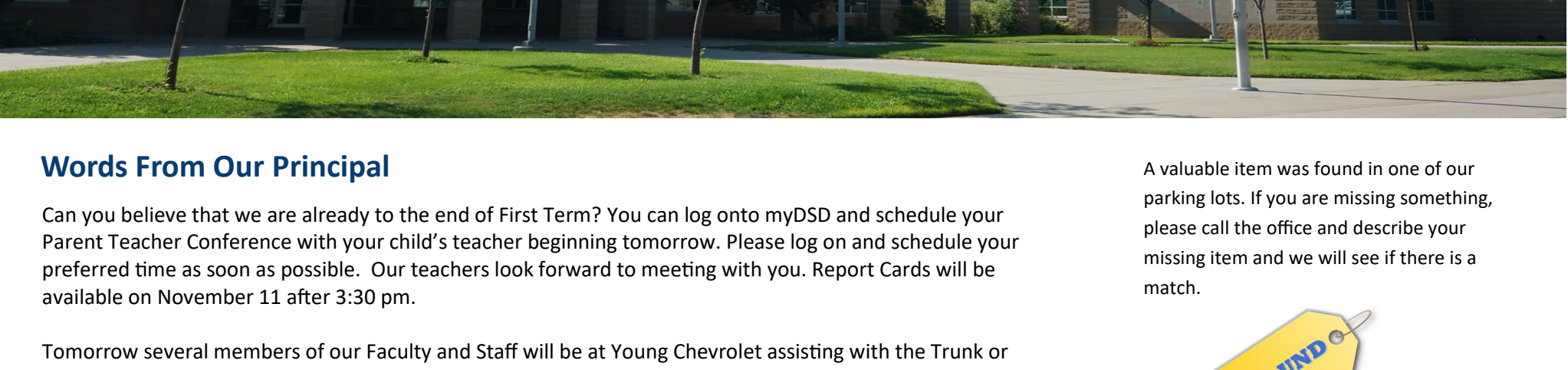

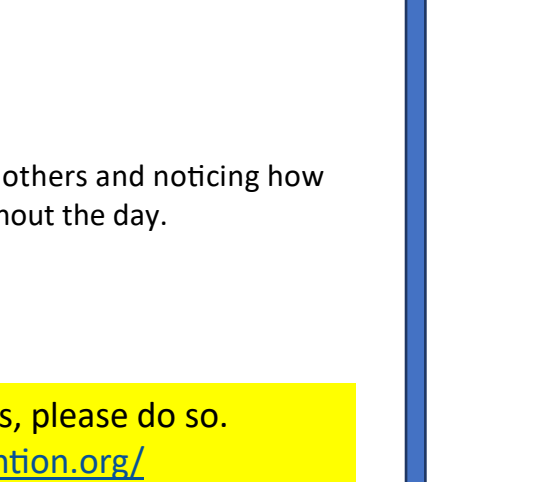
Tomorrow several members of our Faculty and Staff will be at Young Chevrolet assisting with the Trunk or Treat. Be sure to come find us and say Hi.


- The Waterford UPSTART program includes:



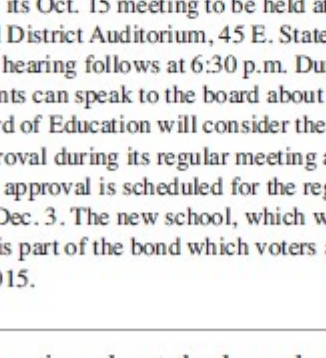
Stop for safety

National School Bus Safety Week Oct. 21-25

Last March, in just one day, 917 school bus stop arm violations were recorded in districts throughout the State.

Red means students ahead

When a bus driver turns on the red flashing lights and puts out the red flashing stop sign, it is illegal for cars to pass from both directions – failure to follow could result in a fine of \$100 or more.



Amber means slow down



If the amber loading lights are flashing (located at the top of the bus), cars can pass slowly – treat it like a 20 mph school zone. Loading lights are activated as the bus approaches a bus stop.

Hazards mean proceed with caution

If the bus has its yellow hazard lights on (often used when picking up special needs children) treat it as a normal vehicle with hazards flashing and proceed with caution.

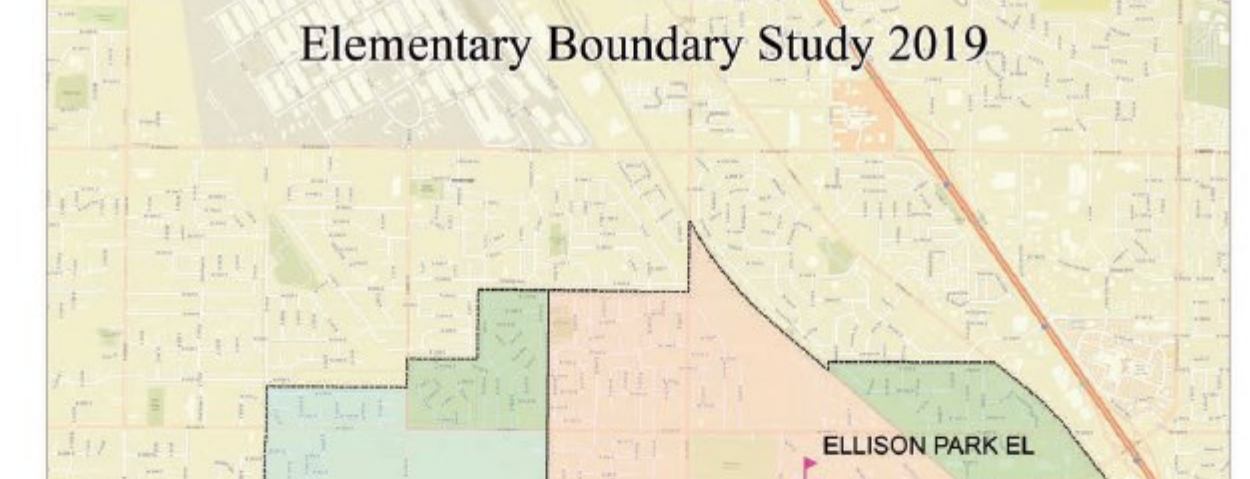


Students crossing



Anytime you see a stopped school bus, watch for kids as they can come from all directions. Children can get on the bus from the right side of the road or cross from the left side. Parents should remind students to never cross behind a bus.

Davis School District Boundary Study Elementary No. 63

Hundreds of comments have been received and a study group has read and considered each one. After careful consideration, these changes have been made to the proposed boundaries.

The boundary study creates boundaries for an elementary school being built in west Layton. The new school relieves overcrowding at Ellison Park, Heritage and Sand Springs elementary schools.

The study group proposes these changes:

- First, a narrow strip of homes on the west boundary of Ellison Park stays at the school (see the map on the next page).
- Second, the proposal also places a group of students east of the railroad tracks in the new school boundaries. These changes were made because of four benefits:

- * It creates a better enrollment balance;
- * Students who were crossing railroad tracks to attend Ellison Park will now receive bus transportation to the new school.

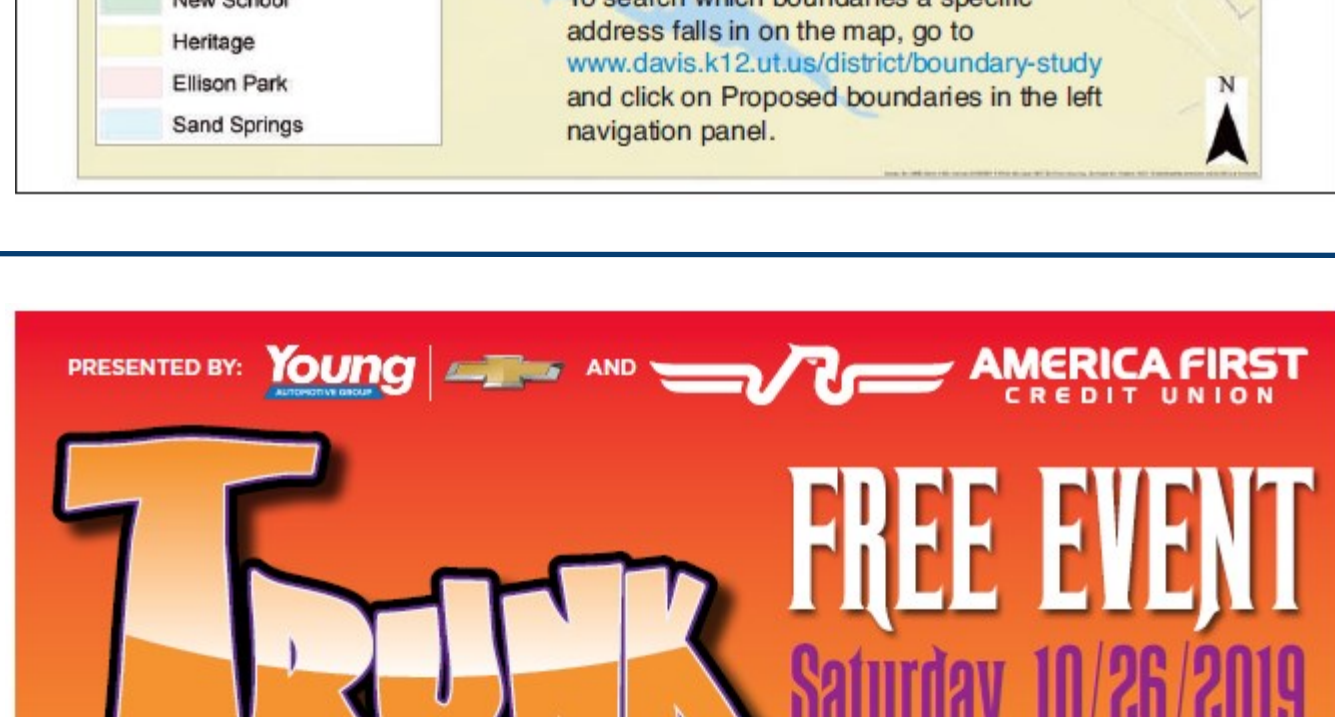
- * Two neighborhoods are kept together;
- * The enrollment at Ellison Park – where significant growth is expected – is lowered;
- * The third change proposes that a small area on the west boundary of Sand Springs Elementary remain at that school. That change improves the walking route for a small group of students and keeps about 40 students, who were in close proximity to the school, at their neighborhood school.

The new proposal will be presented to the Board of Education during its Oct. 15 meeting to be held at 6 p.m. in the Davis School District Auditorium, 45 E. State St., Farmington. A public hearing follows at 6:30 p.m. During that public hearing, parents can speak to the board about the proposal.

The Board of Education will consider the boundaries for tentative approval during its regular meeting at 6 p.m. on Nov. 6. Final approval is scheduled for the regular meeting at 6 p.m. on Dec. 3. The new school, which will open in the fall of 2020, is part of the bond which voters approved in November 2015.
